CHRISTMAS RICHFLEXION

John Donne in a sermon from 1626 preached: The whole life of Christ was a continual passion; others die martyrs, but Christ was born a martyr. He found a Golgotha (where he was crucified) even in Bethlehem, where he was born; for, to his tenderness then, the straws were almost as sharp as the thorns after; and the manger as uneasy at first, as his cross at last. His birth and his death were but one continual act, and his Christmas Day and his Good Friday are but the evening and morning of one and the same day.

Theologian J.I. Packer wrote: The Christmas message is that there is hope for a ruined humanity—hope of pardon, hope of peace with God, hope of glory—because at the Father's will Jesus Christ became poor, and was born in a stable so that thirty years later He might hang on a cross. It is the most wonderful message the world has ever heard or will hear.

Pastor Dave last Sunday preached at Cornerstone Church of Los Banos that in Christ we find real love, true peace, sustaining hope and overflowing joy. All accomplished on the cross but begun in the manger.

I know it seems strange to say it, but the cross is the symbol of Christmas. The good news of great joy that was proclaimed by an angel of the Lord was that in the city of David a Savior was born. To save us would entail bearing our guilt in His own body on the cross. Theologian D.A. Carson captures this humbling and salvific truth with these words: From the Bible's point of view, God owes us justice. God owes us condemnation. But instead, what he gives us is his Son, to die on the cross and to take our sins in his own body on the cross. God doesn't owe us that, but he gives us that.

Celebrating Christmas is reflecting and rejoicing in Christ as Savior.
